

PROGRAM

Daily Life: All campers spend time each day in:

- Arts: Creating visual art, singing, dancing, cooking, harvesting vegetables from our garden, or spending time with a visiting artist-in-residence.
- Sports: Playing sports, climbing on the high ropes challenge course (including zipline), and exploring nature.
- Middot: Exploring Jewish values in engaging, age-appropriate, experiential ways.
- Aquatics: Swimming, boating, and playing in the lake or heated pool.
- Electives: Participating in two breirot (electives) each week, with choices like archery, photography, Zumba, Magic The Gathering, ceramics, swim team, tennis, and more.

Special Programs: Campers go tubing on nearby Lake Wallenpaupack and spend a night camping in the woods. They dress up in silly costumes for weekly theme nights and meet staff from around the world on International Day. They run around with their friends in fun evening programs and sing songs around the campfire. In all we do, we're all about the fun of summer camp with the freedom to be who you truly are.

Jewish: Reconstructionism helps us create an environment that embraces diverse experiences and beliefs while remaining distinctly—and strongly—Jewish. We encourage each camper to explore our traditions and today's world to discover what being Jewish means to them. We begin and end every day with a short all-camp gathering and Shabbat is filled with singing, dancing, and time to decompress after a busy week.

LOCATION

Campus: On 120 acres of beautifully wooded land in the Pocono Mountains of Pennsylvania, the Aaron and Marjorie Ziegelman Campus has a kosher kitchen, heated six-lane swimming pool, private pond, arts center, indoor / outdoor theater, multiple athletic fields and courts, high and low ropes courses, fully equipped Wellness Center, and streams and hiking trails throughout the property. Campers live in cabins with bunk beds, cubbies, toilets, sinks, and showers; high schoolers live in colorful and spacious yurts in the one-of-a-kind Eco-Village.

Food: We're committed to serving food that is fresh, varied, and full of flavor. All of our food is kosher and we have plentiful vegetarian food as well as vegan, lactose free, and gluten free options. (In a commitment to the environment, we generally serve meat no more than five times per week.) We strive to run a nut-free program and we work closely with families to accommodate other food allergies and needs.
